English Translation

Fifty-sixth Contact

Saturday, 19th June 1976, 11:30 hrs

Thought Transmission Contact

Billy:

First of all, I would like to get something straight that gives me no rest: I am sure you remember the last time we talked about Pillen-Paul (Pope Paul VI). It is not clear to me now with your statement how his deposition and murder could actually happen. I do not understand the connections; can you tell me more about it?

Semjase:

1. Sure, but for the time being silence is also the rule here.

Billy:

Of course. So you understand who I am talking about?

2. Certainly.
3. The unfortunate matter happened like this:
4. Through the Vatican Council, a Cardinal named Pietro Pavese was appointed the new Supreme Pontiff of the Catholic Church, who, however, was not willing and unaccommodating to the plans of a certain few bishops and cardinals.
5. By this decision he, Cardinal Pietro Pavese, was given the name Pope Paul VI.
6. But by intriguing machinations of said few Bishops and Cardinals, his appointment as Supreme Pontiff was revoked still in the same hour in a secret circle and in his place a Cardinal with the name Giovanni Battista

Montini, who looked deceptively similar to him in appearance, was then officially proclaimed Pope Paul VI, because he was submissive to the will and desires of the few, but very powerful and radical-conservative Bishops and Cardinals.

14. So you do not need to be specifically ready for him.

Billy:

It is nice of you to tell me, because otherwise I would have had to stay here tomorrow. I have been invited to a flight with one of those apparatuses that you call an explosion bucket or something like that.

Semjase:

15. Be careful, though.

Billy:

Ha, you know, our machines are pretty safe, too.

Semjase:

16. Nevertheless, they are still technically very deficient and unsafe.

Billy:

Are you trying to scare me?

Semjase:

17. That is far from me.
18. I hope you have a good time.

Billy:

Thanks, we probably will, especially me, because Konrad Schutzbach, the pilot, promised me that I could fly the plane myself, although I do not have a flight certificate.

Semjase:

19. That should do it for today, because I am in a hurry.
20. Good luck and joy for Monday too.

Billy:

You know that?

Semjase:

21. Sure, because others cannot block their thoughts like you can.
22. I am hoping it will be a good success.

Billy:

That is up to the reporters, because they write the report.

Semjase:

23. Sure, but there is a lot you can do about it.
24. Well, goodbye, I really must hurry.

Billy:

Okay, can I at least ask if we will see each other again soon?

Semjase:

25. It will be the usual time.

Billy:

I understand, thank you. Then go well and do not overdo yourself if you are in such a hurry.

Semjase:

26. Then – oh yes, I do not want to forget; be careful with your statements to the person who wants to eavesdrop on you about technological issues, etc.
27. It is someone with very bad materialistic tendencies and degenerating evilness.

Billy:

I know, I have been told that on the one hand, and I would have noticed it myself on the other. You do not have to be afraid, I am already on my toes, and even promises of millions leave me cold.

Semjase:

28. Sure, that is why you can do your job faithfully.
29. But I felt obliged to give you advice, because this person is very insidious.

Billy:

I know, you can rest assured.

Semjase:

30. I am really relieved, thank you.
31. Now farewell and pass along all my dear and heartfelt greetings.

Billy:
